

HYDRA Web-Based Training

Training When and Where you Want it!

Now you can have training on HYDRA software anytime and anywhere! Regardless of your geographic location, work schedule, or travel budget, you can learn to use HYDRA when and where you want via the world wide web. Pizer Incorporated announces a new internet-based training option for HYDRA users. The new web-based training is a great option for software users who are unable to attend a training seminar in person.

The first course to be offered in HYDRA Basic Training is Building a Collection System. The course covers the mechanics of using HYDRA to build the conveyance system. The modeling projects in the course use nearly every type of transport unit supported by the program.

The HYDRA Basic Training: Building a Collection System course currently consists of 8 projects, creating small but fully-functional models. Each project intended to take about an hour to complete. The projects each focus on a different feature area, cumulatively building a broad knowledge of how the software works. Each project begins with an introductory video, followed by a series of short tasks for the student to do. Flash demonstrations shows how to perform each task. By completing all the projects, and passing all the quizzes, the student receives a HYDRA Basic Training Certificate.

Key Benefits of HYDRA Web-Based Training

Why web-based training? There are many advantages!

- **Schedule Flexibility.** One benefit of the small-project approach, is the ability to squeeze training into a busy schedule, by doing the training in short sittings over a few weeks. For example, you could do one project a day during lunch and complete the course in 3 weeks. Or if a “crash course” is necessary, you could take the entire course in one or two days. When you register, you’ll have 30 days to complete the course.
- **Cost.** Another benefit is cost savings. Attending a training seminar often involves air travel, hotel, rental car, and many days of eating out at restaurants. For those whose budgets don’t include such expenses for training, the web-based training offers a very affordable alternative.
- **Learn at Your Pace.** Students can go through the material at their own pace. Students who are fast learners can fly through the material as fast as they can click their mouse. Students who need more time, can take as long as they need, even watch the demonstrations multiple times, stopping and starting as needed. No need to worry about missing what the instructor said.
